OPENING CEREMONIES AND RECEPTION

The Opening Ceremonies will be held on Monday, September 23 from 5:00p.m. - 6:00p.m. at Angus Glen Golf Club. During this time, there will be a welcome to all players and coaches and an introduction of the countries and teams. There will be a reception following the official welcoming. All competitors are encouraged to be in team attire for this event.

CLOSING CEREMONIES

The Closing Ceremonies will be held on Friday, September 27, immediately following play. All competitors are encouraged to be in formal dress team attire.

TEAM REGISTRATION

Team registration will take place on Sunday, September 22 at 7:30 a.m. - 11:00 a.m. at Angus Glen Golf Club.

ELIGIBILITY AND COMPETITION FORMAT

Competitors: Three (3) junior girls per country (including an additional Canadian team).

This competition is open to female juniors (in accordance with Golf Canada's transgender policy) who have not reached their 19th birthday by the last scheduled day of the championship, September 27, 2019 and who are members in good standing with their respective golf federation and who are not playing university or college golf.

Coaches and Delegates

- One (1) coach (or Non-Playing Captain), as determined by participating golf federations.
- Team Competition: 72-hole Stroke Play, Individual Competition: 72-hole Stroke Play

Stroke Play - Team

- Each team will count their 2 lowest scores each day these scores will represent their team total.
- The team champion is awarded to the team with the lowest aggregate total following 72-holes.

- Each individual will post a gross score each day
- The individual champion is awarded to the lowest aggregate individual total following 72-holes.

HOST CLUB AND VENUE



Angus Glen Golf Club consists of two 18-hole championship golf courses in Markham, Ontario. The North and South courses offer variety, beauty and challenge. Arthur Stollery, an avid golfer, began building the golf course in 1992 in the valley where Black Angus cattle once grazed. Parts of the original farm, which still operates, can be seen adjacent to many of the golf holes. The Stollery family opened the course to the public in 1995 and was ranked as the Best New Course in Canada by Golf Digest Magazine. Angus Glen is known for its outstanding personal service and provides golfers with the experience of a first-class private golf club within a public facility, accessible to all. In addition, the club includes a Nike Pro Shop and the Silo Grill Restaurant.

Angus Glen Golf Club has been ranked as one of the top 80 golf courses in the world outside of the United States. It was home to the 2002 and 2007 Canadian Open and an official host of the 2015 Toronto Pan/Parapan American Games.

TRANSPORTATION

Toronto Pearson International Airport:

Toronto Pearson International Airport is the primary international airport serving Toronto, its metropolitan area, and surrounding region known as the Golden Horseshoe in the province of Ontario, Canada. The airport is approximately a 25-minute drive to Markham and approximately 30 minutes away from downtown Toronto. The UP-Train Express will take you from Pearson Airport to downtown Toronto, Union Station in under 30 minutes.


