Re: WAAP update – 7th to 10th October 2021

We would like to provide an update concerning the date, venue and invitation process for the 2021 Women's Amateur Asia Pacific.

- The date is the 7th to 10th October 2021 and the venue remains the same, the Waterside Course at Siam Country Club, Pattaya, Thailand.
- Invitations will be issued on the 24th June 2021 and the players' World Amateur Golf Ranking as at this date will be used to determine the field. The player eligibility conditions remain the same as per previous WAAPs.
- We will confirm more details in due course regarding the Covid-19 situation in Thailand and how this will impact on the WAAP. At this stage we are likely to operate a Covid-bubble where all players and officials must stay in the bubble that will operate at the hotel and golf course. They will not be able to leave the bubble areas or mix with outside, but we will have a number of activities and food and beverage options at both areas.
- The various measures will be in place to prioritise the safety and security of all players and officials. We will therefore cover all associated Covid costs in Thailand for players and tournament officials plus international travel to Thailand for players.
- Please note that at this stage it is not likely we can accommodate many additional people outside the players and officials group in the tournament bubble but we will continue to monitor this situation as conditions hopefully improve.
- The team staging the Honda LPGA at Siam Country Club, that will be held from the 6th to 9th May 2021, will be the same team which will stage the WAAP and therefore we will assess how this championship operates and it provides a good platform for the WAAP to operate.

We are very much planning to stage the WAAP in 2021 but will continue to monitor the situation in Thailand regarding travel and other Covid matters.
