# SINGAPORE JUNIOR GOLF CHAMPIONSHIP 2013 <br> KEPPEL CLUB <br> 3-6 June 2013 

## CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

The following conditions, together with any additions or amendments as published by the Organising Committee at the host club, will apply under Rule 33-1 to this Championship.

## GENERAL

1. The Singapore Junior Golf Championship 2012 will be played at the Keppel Club from 3 to 6 June 2013 in accordance with the Rules of Golf as approved by R\&A Rules Limited and with the Local Rules approved by the Organising Committee.

## ELIGIBILITY

2. Entries are open to all boys and girls between the ages of 12 and 17 years as at 4 June 2013 and with a USGA Handicap Index of 16.0 or lower for boys and 18.0 or lower for girls, as at 1st May 2013.
3. All entries will be subject to the approval of the Organising Committee (OC) which reserves the right to accept or refuse, or having accepted, subsequently reject any entry without giving reason for its decision.
4. Entrants must conform in all respects to the Rules of Amateur Status as approved by R\&A Rules Limited.

## TOURNAMENT FORMAT OF PLAY

5. The Championship will be decided by stroke play over three rounds of 18 holes. A cut will be made after 36 holes for the top $60 \%$ of the respective age groups who shall qualify for the final round.
6. The Overall Boy and Girl Champion shall be the player with the lowest gross aggregate score over the three rounds.
7. Players will also compete in the respective age groups. They are:
a. Boys between 15 and 17 years of age;
b. Girls between 15 and 17 years of age;
c. Boys between 12 and 14 years of age;
d. Girls between 12 and 14 years of age.
8. An International Team Event will be held in conjunction with the Championship. It shall be played over three rounds of the Championship. Each team will be represented by two players ( 1 boy and 1 girl from any age groups) who shall be citizens or permanent residents of the country they represent. Team members who do not make the cut will be allowed to play in the final round for the International Team Event.
9. The Winning Team shall be the team with the lowest combined gross scores of the team members for the three rounds.
10. In the event of insufficient entries, the Team Event may be cancelled.

## SIZE OF FIELD

11. The field will be limited to a maximum of 100 participants. Entries will be accepted from 100 applicants with the lowest Handicap Index.
12. The OC reserves the right to refuse any entry without assigning any reason for such refusal. The decisions of the OC as to the acceptance or refusal of any entry shall be final.

## ENTRY

13. The entry fee is $\mathbf{S} \$ 85.00$ (inclusive of GST) and must be submitted at the time of entry. Cheques must be made payable to "Singapore Golf Association". Participants who are members of SGA Ordinary Members may have their entry fee debited through their Home Club. There will be no refund of entry fee after the closing date.
14. Entries must be on the official entry form duly endorsed by the Captain, General Manager or Golf Manager of the players' home club. If a player has his Handicap Index maintained at more than one Club, he shall play off the lower/lowest Handicap Index.
15.Entries must be submitted to the Singapore Golf Association, No. 249 Sembawang Road Singapore 758352. Proof of posting is not proof of receipt.
15. The OC reserves the right to limit, accept or reject entries.

## CLOSING DATE

17. The closing date is 17 May 2013. Late entries may be accepted at the sole discretion of the OC.

## DRAW

18. The draw for the first and second rounds will be made by the OC prior to start of the Championship.
19. The draw for the final round will be based on the cumulative gross scores of the preceding rounds.

## TIME OF STARTING

20. Players shall start at the time and in the order indicated in the draw. No substitution of players and changes of starting times shall be permitted after the draw has been made.
21. The OC reserves the right to fix and/or alter the starting times.

## SUBMISSION OF SCORECARD

22. Players should check their cards in the returning area (scoring table) and ensure that they are correct and signed. Any doubtful points should be settled with the OC before returning the scorecard.
23. A player is deemed to have returned his scorecard and no further amendments may be made once he has left the returning area (scoring table) or the demarcated area where they exist.

## DECISION OF TIES

24. Individual Event - In the event of a tie or ties for the first place, the Champion shall be decided by a hole by hole play-off to take place as soon as practicable. The purpose of the play-off is to decide the Champion only. In the event inclement weather or other reasons make the play-off impractical, the Organising Committee's decision to determine the Champion is final.
25. All other ties will be decided on the lowest score for the last 18 holes (or the last 9 or 6 or 3 or $18^{\text {th }}$ Hole). If a tie still arises, the scores for the 2 nd round and, if necessary, the 1st round will be treated in the same way until a decision is reached.
26. International Team Event - In the event of a tie or ties for the first and any place, the tie will be decided on the lowest combined team scores of the last round. If a tie still arises, the combined team scores of the 2nd round and, if necessary, the 1st round will be used until a decision is reached. The Organising Committee's decision to determine the Winning Team is final.

## SUSPENSION OF PLAY FOR DANGEROUS SITUATION (NOTE TO RULE 6-8b)

27. The specimen Condition in the Rules of Golf is in effect - see pages 140 - 141.
28. All practice areas that are in open areas shall be closed during suspension for a dangerous situation until the OC has declared them open.
29. A suspension of play for a dangerous situation and the resumption of play shall be signaled using the host club's warning system.

## INCLEMENT WEATHER

30. In the event that the first round of the Championship cannot be completed, it shall be continued the next day prior to the commencement of the second round.
31. In the event that the second round of the Championship cannot be completed, it shall be continued the next day prior to the commencement of the third round.
32. In the event that the second and/or third round of the Championship cannot be completed, the rounds shall be abandoned. The result of the Championship will then be based on the completed rounds.

## CADDIES / BUGGIES / MOTORISED TROLLEYS

33. The use of caddies / buggies / motorised trolley in this Championship is prohibited.
34. All players are to carry their own bags or use their own hand-drawn trolleys.

## PACE OF PLAY

35. Rule 6-7 (Undue Delay; Slow Play) will be strictly enforced using the 'Group Pace of Play' system. See separate memorandum to players for the Pace of Play guidelines.

## DISPUTES OR DOUBTS AS TO PROCEDURE

36. If there is a doubt as to the correct procedures, players are to refer to the Tournament Rules Official. If a Tournament Rules Official is not immediately available, a player (having notified his marker) may elect to play two balls in accordance with Rule 3-3 and obtain a ruling at the conclusion of the round, prior to signing and the return of the score card.
37. No spectators (including parents or accompanying officials) are to enter into any discussion on a matter under dispute.

## TOURNAMENT RULES OFFICIALS/REFEREE

38. The Tournament Rules Officials/Referee's decision on all matters pertaining to the Rules of Golf is final.

## INSURANCE

39. All players are required to have appropriate golfing insurance. Proof of insurance coverage must be submitted together with the entry form.

## Distance Measuring Device

40. Players must not use any distance measuring device in any form during the stipulated round. Use of any such Distance Measuring Device will be a breach of Rule 14-3. Penalty for breach is DISQUALIFICATION.

41. The specimen Condition in the Rules of Golf is in effect - see page 138.

42. The specimen Condition in the Rules of Golf is in effect - see pages $137-138$.

## PRIZES

43. The following prizes will be awarded:
a. Overall Boys \& Girls Champion \& Runner-Up;
b. Best Local Boy Performer;
c. Age Group - Best Gross Winner \& Runner-Up;
d. Age Group - Daily Best Gross;
e. The International Team Event - Top three teams.

Note: The Champion and the Runner-Up are not eligible for the Age Group Best Gross Winner and Runner-Up.

## PRACTICE

44. The course is available to players for practice on 3 Jun 2013 (morning only). Please call the SGA Office at Tel: 67555976 from 29 May to 31 Jun 2013 to book practice round.
45. No multiple ball play shall be allowed during the practice round.
46. Players are not allowed to practise on the course after their round on any day of the Championship.
47. The driving range will be opened at 7am during the Championship. Range balls are chargeable at $\mathrm{S} \$ 3$ per 50 balls.

## PRIZE PRESENTATION LUNCHEON

48. All players are invited to a Prize Presentation Luncheon on 6 Jun 2013 at the Keppel Hall, Keppel Club.

## DRESS CODE

49. Players must be properly attired on the golf course. Blue jeans, designer jeans, round neck T-shirts and tank tops are prohibited. Golf shirts must be worn and shorts must be no shorter than mid-thigh (no jean shorts).
50. This dress code will be used in conjunction with any additional dress code restrictions of the host club. A player violating this dress code will not be permitted to start the tournament. A violation of this dress code by a player during the stipulated round must be rectified without undue delay or the player will not be allowed to continue play.
51. Soft spikes shoes are compulsory.

## CONDUCT OF PLAYERS

52. All players should conduct themselves in a disciplined manner, demonstrating courtesy and sportsmanship at all times, irrespective of how competitive they may be.
53. Any action contrary to the spirit of the game such as abusive language, throwing of clubs, or other disruptive behavior, will not be tolerated and may result in a player not being able to continue in this competition.
54. The use of mobile phones (except in an emergency) and smoking are not allowed on the course.

## SPECTATORS/ ACCOMPANYING OFFICIALS /PARENTS

55. Spectators/accompanying officials/parents must remain on the cart paths at all times. They must stay off the greens and out of the bunkers at all times. They are prohibited from using golf buggies.
56. They should maintain a reasonable distance from the players to avoid the appearance that they are imparting advice or assisting the player in any way. They may approach a player for a moment to exchange clothing, food, or beverages, but should not have prolonged contact.
57. Those found violating these policies may be asked to leave the course.

59. Daily room rate is $\mathrm{S} \$ 160.00$ nett, inclusive of buffet breakfast for single/twin occupancy. Additional bed will cost $\mathrm{S} \$ 50.00$ nett.

## LOCAL TRANSPORTATION

60. Local transfer from hotel to club and vice versa will be provided to foreign nominated players staying at the official hotel during the Championship.

## FOREIGN PARTICIPANTS

61. Visitors to Singapore must hold valid travel documents with a minimum validity of 6 months. Please visit the website: http://app.ica.gov.sg to check on visa requirement.

## AMENDMENTS TO CONDITIONS

62. The OC reserves the right to amend these Championship conditions.

## MEMORANDUM ON PACE OF PLAY

Notice to Players
Group Pace of Play Policy

1. The maximum time allowed for the round will be decided by the Tournament Committee. The hole by hole allotted time is provided on the Official Notice Board in the Notice to Competitors.
2. The Singapore Golf Association's Pace of Play policy leaves the responsibility for maintaining the pace of play where it belongs, with the player. The first group in the field should play efficient golf. The following groups should keep up with the group in front of them.
3. There will be time-keepers present on the 4th, 9th, 13th and 18th holes with whom players can check on their pace.
4. The first group in the field must complete play at the 9th hole and 18th hole no later than the time established by the Tournament Committee. Subsequent groups are held to the same standard. If they are unable to meet the prescribed standard due to slow play ahead of them they will be considered to have met the standard if they complete play at a 9th hole and 18th hole within 14 minutes of the group ahead of them. A group is considered to have completed the play of a hole when all players in the group have holed out and the flagstick is replaced in the hole.
5. Subsequent groups, other than the lead group, which are OUT OF POSITION (behind the allotted time AND more than 14 minutes behind the preceding group) after finishing the 9th or 18 th hole will be liable to Pace of Play penalty for every player in the group.
6. Pace of play penalty will be added to the score on the 9th or 18th hole. The tournament officials or Rules officials will notify players officially on this. No advice will be issued to players with this Pace of Play policy at the intermediate checkpoints but officials will endeavor to do so at check points on the 4th and 13th hole advising that the group may be liable to slow play penalty at the 9th or 18th hole.

## OUT OF POSITION

7. First Group Only: If the lead group is behind its expected time after completing the intermediate check point, the group may be advised that they are liable to a penalty if they fail to complete the first nine holes in their expected time.
8. If they pass the second intermediate check point, behind their expected time, the group may be advised that they are liable to penalty if they do not complete the round within their expected time. If they have had a penalty on the first nine holes and again fail to complete the round of eighteen holes within their expected
time, two strokes penalty will be added to their score on the finishing hole. A group may appeal in the scoring area before submitting their scorecards.
9. Subsequent Groups: If any subsequent group completes the intermediate checkpoint behind its expected time AND more than 14 minutes behind the preceding group, the group may be advised they are liable to a penalty if they fail to complete the first nine behind their expected time AND are more than 14 minutes behind the group in front of them.
10. If they pass the second intermediate check point behind their expected time AND are more than 14 minutes behind the group in front, they may be advised that they are liable to slow play penalty if they do not complete the round within their expected time AND are more than 14 minutes behind the group in front.
11. If they have had a penalty on the first nine holes and again fail to complete the round of eighteen holes within their expected time AND are more than 14 minutes behind the group in front when they complete the round, two strokes penalty will be added to their score on the finishing hole. A group may appeal in the scoring area before submitting their scorecards.
12. Note: Players will be advised that they are behind on their pace of play and may be liable to penalties should they fail to meet the expected time when they complete the nine holes or complete the round. Penalties on the 9th or 18th hole may be assessed even if no advice have been given to the group at the intermediate checkpoints. A group that receives a penalty on the first nine holes is not absolved from penalty if the group completes the second nine holes in position and on time.
13. In the notice to players, the allotted time on a hole by hole basis will be provided on the Official Notice Board. These times are adjusted based on the difficulty of the course and the ability of the field. They include time to search for lost balls and deal with other common occurrences encountered during play. A normal speed of play should result in completing play before the time indicated. If a group falls behind, they are expected to play efficient golf and make up the lost time. This might mean playing ready golf or continuous putting, which are both allowed in stroke play.
14. It is the PLAYERS' RESPONSIBILITY to know their group's position relative to the published Pace of Play and to ensure they play within the published limits. Failure to play within the Pace of Play guidelines will result in a Pace of Play penalty unless players appeal and the Committee upholds their appeal.
15. A player concerned about a slow player(s) in his group should first speak with the player(s) and encourage them to play more efficiently. Then, the concerned player may, before or after penalties are assessed, ask to have the group monitored. The individual player does not have to be identified; the request just needs to be made. At some point during the stipulated round, the group will be
monitored. If a player is identified as holding up the pace of the group, penalties may be applied to that player and rescinded from the others.

## Appeal Process

16. Pace of Play penalties may be appealed to the Committee and must be made before scorecards are signed and returned. In order for an appeal to be considered, there must have been an action by the Committee, a circumstance beyond the player's control, or some similar occurrence that contributed to the delay, such as an action by an individual member of the group.
17. If a group receives a penalty for exceeding the pace of play for each nine, both penalties may be appealed, however, each appeal must be made and handled separately. Each appeal may result in a one step reduction of a penalty (i.e., three strokes to one stroke then one stroke to no penalty, but not three strokes to no penalty).

Penalties for Breach of Pace of Play Policy
18.1st Breach of the Pace of Play Policy - One Stroke Penalty;
19.2nd Breach of the Pace of Play Policy - Two Strokes Penalty.
20. The maximum penalty per round of 18 holes is 3 Strokes.
