INTRODUCTION AND WELCOME

Conducted by Golf Canada in partnership with Golf Ontario, the World Junior Girls Golf Championship returns for its fourth year in 2017. The event – which is supported by the International Golf Federation, will receive grant funding by the Ontario Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Sport, Sport Canada, and the R&A. This year's international competition will be a recognized counting event on the World Amateur Golf Rankings.

The World Junior Girls Golf Championship will be held from September 24th to September 29th, 2017 at The Marshes Golf Club in Kanata, Ontario. The venue is approximately 33 minutes from the Ottawa Macdonald-Cartier International Airport in Ottawa, Ontario.

ELIGIBILITY AND FORMAT

Competitors: Three (3) junior girls per country (including an additional Canadian team).

This competition is open to female juniors (in accordance with Golf Canada's transgender policy) who have not reached their 19th birthday by the last scheduled day of the championship, September 29th, 2017 and who are members in good standing with their respective golf federation and who are not playing university or college golf.

Coaches and Delegates: One (1) coach (or Non-Playing Captain), as determined by participating golf federations.

VENUE

The 2017 World Junior Girls Golf Championship will be returning to The Marshes Golf Club in Kanata, Ontario. The Marshes represents the final design collaboration between Robert Trent Jones, Jr. and Sr. The designers were presented with an unusual site that encompassed many natural features such as wetlands, meadows, and hardwood forests. The course was carefully routed around these natural features to enhance the golfing experience and to provide a strategic interest. The championship style golf course has hosted five PGA of Canada Senior Championships as well as many local and provincial amateur championships.

The first six holes at The Marshes wind through hardwood forest and meadow. Considerable sculpting was performed to create the rolling terrain here among a rocky, tree-studded landscape. The design philosophy called for many bent grass chipping areas around generously contoured greens. The ninth and eighteenth greens share a putting surface that occupies 30,000 sq. ft, an apt metaphor for the entire golf course design, which is big by any standard, including standards of innovation.

With as many as five tee decks per hole, The Marshes' will challenge and reward golfers of every caliber. The course design recognized that the landscape presented a number of nooks and crannies ideally suited for par 3's. As a result, The Marshes features a somewhat unusual balance of six par-three, six par-four and six par-five holes.

AIRPORT AND TRANSPORTATION

Ottawa Macdonald-Cartier International Airport is Canada's sixth busiest airport by airline passenger traffic and fifth busiest by aircraft movements. In 2014, the airport was recognized for outstanding customer service in the Airport Service Quality (ASQ) benchmarking program. Ottawa placed third in the world among airports that serve between two and five million passengers per year and placed fifth among all airports in North America. The Ottawa Airport is located 14.3km just south of Downtown Ottawa, and serves directly to the city of Ottawa, but also to the greater province of Ontario that has 12 Million of inhabitants.

Travel for all delegations will be coordinated by the Transportation Coordinator and all non-domestic flights will be covered by Golf Canada and Golf Ontario for three (3) players and one (1) coach (or Non-Playing Captain) in economy class for the top 15 teams. All additional personnel with participating nations will be at the expense of the Federation.

The COC will work with the Transportation Chair to organize the welcoming of delegations as they arrive and to provide teams with information and assistance.




Must Do:
