Closing Date for Entries Monday 14 May 2018

CONDITIONS

1. ENTRIES

- a) The Junior Open Championship is open to boys and girls who are amateur golfers in accordance with the current Amateur Status Rules of R&A Rules Limited. Competitors must hold a current CONGU, or overseas equivalent, Exact Handicap not exceeding 15.4 at date of entry and be under 16 years of age at 00:01hrs GMT on 1 January 2018 but over 12 years of age by 16 July 2018. Entrants must be nominated by an R&A affiliated organisation. Each such affiliate may send one boy and/or one girl to compete.
- b) R&A affiliates must submit their nominee(s) electronically via the weblink provided by separate email. Nominations must be received by close of entries ie. 23:59hrs GMT on Monday 14 May 2018. One entry per nominee is required to be submitted. All Championship information including a list of accepted entries may be viewed at www.randa.org. Late entries will not be accepted.
- c) Acceptance of an online entry does not guarantee a place in the starting field. Competitors successful in gaining places in the starting field will be advised after the entry closing date. If an entrant is withdrawn before or after the closure of entries, their withdrawal is final and re-entry will not be permitted.
- d) All entries are subject to the approval of the Amateur Events Committee which reserves the right to disqualify any competitor following a false statement on his/her online entry and to accept or refuse or, having accepted, subsequently reject any entry without giving reason for its decision.
- e) Competitors must bring to the Championship proof of their current handicap.
- f) All competitors are subject to the provisions of The International Golf Federation's Anti-Doping Policy. Details of the Policy, and the current List of Prohibited Substances and Methods, are available from the IGF website (www.igf.com). Competitors who are taking medication and in doubt as to their clinical status should seek advice from The R&A or IGF knowing that, should a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) be required this must be submitted to the IGF not later than 30 days before the start of the Championship.

2. FORMAT

- a) The starting field will be limited to 144. In the event of entries exceeding this number, those entrants failing to gain a starting place will be placed on a waiting list administered by the Amateur Events Committee.
- b) The Championship shall consist of 54 holes stroke play played in accordance with the Rules of Golf as approved by R&A Rules Limited and in accordance with the Local Rules approved by the Amateur Events Committee. One round of 18 holes shall be played on each of the first two days, for which one draw will be made. The competitors returning the 80 lowest gross scores, plus any tying for 80th place, over the first 36 holes shall qualify for the final 18 holes on the third day. For the final 18 holes, the pairings and starting times shall be determined by the qualifying scores, with the leaders starting last.
- c) In the event of a tie for the Championship there shall be a hole by hole play-off immediately after the final scores have been recorded.
- d) A player is prohibited from having a caddie during the stipulated round. Penalty for Breach of Condition:

Two strokes for each hole at which any breach occurred; maximum penalty per round – Four strokes.

In the event of a breach between the play of two holes, the penalty applies to the next hole.

A player having a caddie in breach of this condition must immediately upon discovery that a breach has occurred ensure that she conforms with this condition for the remainder of the stipulated round. Otherwise the player is disqualified.
- e) The specimen conditions in the Rules of Golf are in effect regarding Conforming Golf Balls.
- f) Competitors shall walk at all times during a stipulated round and must not ride on any form of transportation unless permitted by the Championship Committee.

3. PRIZES

- a) Competitors achieving the best net score in their region, over the first two rounds, will receive a trophy. A list of countries included in each region will be made public at the event. In the event of a tie after two rounds for a regional trophy, the winner will be decided on the lowest net score for the last 18 holes (or 9 or 6 or 3 or 1 hole with handicaps reduced accordingly). If a tie still arises, the 1st round will be treated in the same way until a decision is reached.
- b) The winner will become the Junior Open Champion for the year and will receive the Championship Trophy. The runner up and the competitor in third place will receive a trophy.
- c) It is a condition of the Championship that a competitor may not be awarded more than one trophy. In such a case, the regional trophy will be awarded to the competitor returning the next best score.

4. GENERAL

- a) The R&A is not liable to pay any money by way of compensation for any loss, damage, cost or expense suffered by any affiliate which was not reasonably foreseeable when an entry/entries was/were confirmed after the closing date, and/or was not caused by the event organisers.
- b) If a competitor is found to have breached Etiquette, the Amateur Events Committee will take appropriate action which may include reporting the facts to the competitor's R&A affiliate. If the breach is considered to be serious, the competitor may be disqualified.
- c) All competitors are subject to the provisions of The R&A's Anti-Corruption and Betting Policy in force at the date of the Championship.
- d) R&A Championships Limited seeks media coverage and publicity for The Junior Open around and during the Championship via both the written press and broadcast and audio-visual media. Each competitor, by being entered to the Championship and by agreeing to these terms and conditions, assigns to R&A Championships Limited and its assignees and licensees the right in perpetuity throughout the world to make, use, edit, exhibit and reproduce (and to authorise others to do so) in any and all media (whether Press, radio, television, internet or otherwise), whether now known or hereafter devised for commercial and/or other purposes from time to time and at their discretion, any and all pictures, coverage, recordings and any other reproductions of any description of the competitor made during or in connection with the Championship (including, without limitation, during practice and play) without compensation for the competitor or the heirs, successors, executors, administrators or assignees of the competitor. The competitor also assigns the right to use and reproduce their name, voice, likeness and biographical material in any way now known or hereafter devised by R&A Championships Limited for the purpose of promoting the Championship and any subsequent Championships, without compensation for the competitor or the heirs, successors, executors, administrators or assignees of the competitor including in circumstances where it may include the logo of a third party or of a sponsor or patron of the Championship or any subsequent Championship or any other activities undertaken by R&A Championships Limited. Notwithstanding the foregoing grant of rights, R&A Championships Limited and its assignees and licensees agree that, other than as permitted above, they will not authorise any company contractually associated with R&A Championships Limited to use the competitor's name, voice, likeness and biographical material in a way which constitutes the endorsement of a product or service, without first requiring such associated company to obtain the competitor's authorisation. R&A Championships Limited may also use any image of the competitor taken at the Championship to populate the relevant pages of the WORLD AMATEUR GOLF RANKING™ website at wagr.com
- e) The Amateur Events Committee's objective is to complete the Championship as per the format outlined in these Conditions. The Amateur Events Committee reserves the right to amend these Conditions at any time including the right to arrange and /or alter starting times. The decision of the Amateur Events Committee is final in all matters.
- f) These Conditions will be governed by and interpreted in accordance with the law of Scotland.

IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF EACH R&A AFFILIATE TO ENSURE THEIR NOMINATED COMPETITOR(S) COMPLIES WITH ALL THE CONDITIONS OF THE CHAMPIONSHIP.

Participant Privacy Policy

This policy contains important information about how we use your personal information when you enter and participate in an R&A championship or team event or if you make a scholarship application or an application for reinstatement to Amateur Status to The R&A. We have tried to keep it simple, so please take the time to read this policy in full to understand our practices regarding your personal information. This policy was last updated in February 2018.

For the purposes of applicable UK and EU data protection laws, R&A Championships Limited (SC247047) is the data controller for use of personal information for R&A championships and team events. R&A Rules Limited (SC247046) is the data controller for scholarship and Amateur Status reinstatement applications. R&A Championships Limited and R&A Rules Limited will share your personal information with their group companies and their suppliers for the purposes set out below only. The references to "we", "us", "our" and "The R&A" in this policy are to any and all of these organisations.

I am applying to enter an R&A championship

We collect personal information about you that we need to process your entry to the championship. We collect this information from you via the online entry process or if we ask you to provide further information. This information includes your contact details, date of birth, nationality, your handicap (if you are an amateur) and your golf club or attachment.

We use the personal information that you provide during the entry process to:

- contact you to confirm that we have received your entry and to process your entry and assess whether you meet the eligibility criteria for the championship;
- process the payment details you provided for payment of your entry fee for the championship. We will retain your payment details for such period as may be necessary to allow us to process any refund of your entry fee that may be due to you;
- group you together with other entrants to determine the starting field and reserve list for the championship; and
- contact you if we have any queries about your entry and to notify you if you have been successful or unsuccessful in gaining a place in the starting field or if you have been placed on the reserve list for the championship.

Our legal basis for processing your personal information for the above purposes is that it is necessary for our relationship with you established by your entry to the championship. The R&A cannot process your entry to the championship if you do not provide the information required by the entry process.

For entrants under 18 years of age only, we may use your parent/guardian's details provided during the entry process to contact them to verify the details on your entry. We do this with the parent/guardian's consent provided on your online entry form.

We maintain a historical archive and record of entries to R&A championships. For these purposes, we retain a copy of all entry forms submitted for a championship indefinitely. It is in the legitimate interests of The R&A as the organiser of long-standing, prestigious golf competitions to maintain a historical archive of entries to those competitions.

To keep you updated, we may also use information provided on your entry to provide you with information on Rules updates or similar information regarding the sport of golf including via email. This is not only beneficial for you but it is in the legitimate interests of The R&A in its governing body role for the sport of golf, to communicate Rules changes and developments in the sport of golf.

I am a competitor in an R&A championship

If you are a competitor in an R&A championship, we collect and use the following personal information about you:

- information provided by you as part of the entry process for the championship;
- additional information you provide to us during the registration process at the championship by returning the competitor registration form;
- images and video footage of you taken during your participation in the R&A championship or other R&A championships and events;
- occasionally, we may collect information about you from publicly available websites;
- if you submit a Transportation Request Form. For details about information collected via the Transportation Request Form and how it is used, please see the section below on "I have submitted a Transportation Request Form".

We use your personal information as a competitor:

- to process your participation in the championship;
- to publish the starting fields and reserve lists on www.randa.org and to contact you with further information about your participation in the championship;
- to publish the live scoring and final results of the R&A championship;
- for the purposes of television, radio, written press and online media coverage and publicity of the R&A championship including as part of television, radio and other interviews you may be asked to give as part of your participation in the championship;
- to promote the R&A championship, other R&A championships and other R&A events, to promote The R&A and its activities and to illustrate The R&A's work in golf, e.g. golf development activities and education. This includes use of images and footage of you taken at the R&A championship or other R&A championships and events;
- to provide personal data to the golf club hosting the R&A championship as required for the purposes of hosting the championship;
- to confirm your participation and provide your scores from the R&A championship to your golf club/attachment; and
- if applicable, to provide your personal information to the WORLD AMATEUR GOLF RANKING™ to update the rankings and player profiles on www.wagr.com. This will include your date of birth only if you have given your consent for this on the entry form for an R&A amateur championship. Please see www.wagr.com for more information.

We may also share your personal information collected and used as a competitor of the R&A championship with our patrons, sponsors and partners for their use for the above purposes only.

Our legal basis for processing your personal information for the above purposes is that it is necessary for our relationship with you established by your participation in the championship. For providing your personal information to the WORLD AMATEUR GOLF RANKING™, our legal basis is that it is necessary for the legitimate interests of the operation, improvement and expansion of the WORLD AMATEUR GOLF RANKING™ and www.wagr.com.

On the competitor registration form, we also collect medical information only for the purposes of allowing medical assistance to be given to you if necessary during the championship. We obtain your explicit consent for this but this personal information is also required to protect your vital interests.

For competitors under 18 years of age only, we may use your parent/guardian's details provided on the competitor registration form to contact them to verify the details on form.

Retention periods:

- The competitor registration forms and the emergency contacts details and medical information contained on those forms are retained until after the championship and are destroyed no later than 31 December of that year.
- The other information shall be retained for as long as it is required for the purposes above.

I am competing in an R&A team event

We collect personal information about you that we need as part of your selection and participation in an R&A team event, such as the Vagliano Trophy. We collect this information from national golf federations, via the team member registration form and from publicly available websites. This information includes your contact details, date of birth, nationality and your golf club or attachment.

We use your personal information as a team member:

- to contact you to inform you that you have been selected as a team member and to confirm this to your national golf federation and golf club;
- for the purposes of your travel to and from and participation in the R&A team event including to arrange your travel to and from the R&A team event;
- to publish the starting fields and reserve lists on www.randa.org and to contact you with further information about your participation in the championship;
- to publish the team selection, the live scoring and final results of the R&A team event;
- for the purposes of television, radio, written press and online media coverage and publicity of the R&A team event including as part of television, radio and other interviews you may be asked to give as part of your participation in the team event;
- to promote the R&A team event, other R&A championships and other R&A events, to promote The R&A and its activities and to illustrate The R&A's work in golf, e.g. golf development activities and education. This includes use of images and footage of you taken at the R&A team event or other R&A championships and events;
- to provide personal data to the golf club hosting the R&A team event as required for the purposes of hosting the event;
- if applicable, to provide your personal information to the WORLD AMATEUR GOLF RANKING™ to update the rankings and player profiles on www.wagr.com. This will include your date of birth only if you have given your consent for this on the entry form for an R&A amateur championship. Please see www.wagr.com for more information.

We may also share your personal information collected and used as a competitor in an R&A team event with our patrons, sponsors and partners for their use for the above purposes only.

Our legal basis for processing your personal information for the above purposes is that it is necessary for our relationship with you established by your participation in the team event. For providing your personal information to the WORLD AMATEUR GOLF RANKING™, our legal basis is that it is necessary for the legitimate interests of the operation, improvement and expansion of the WORLD AMATEUR GOLF RANKING™ and www.wagr.com.

On the team member registration form, we also collect medical information only for the purposes of allowing medical assistance to be given to you if necessary during your travel to and from and participation in the team event. We obtain your explicit consent for this but this personal information is also required to protect your vital interests.

For competitors under 18 years of age only, we may use your parent/guardian's details provided on the team member registration form to contact them to verify the details on form.

Retention periods:

- The team member registration forms and the emergency contacts details and medical and disability information contained on those forms are retained until after the team event and are destroyed no later than 31 December of that year.
- The other information shall be retained for as long as it is required for the purposes above.

To keep you updated, we may also use information provided on your team member registration form to provide you with information on Rules updates or similar information regarding the sport of golf including via email. This is not only beneficial for you but it is in the legitimate interests of The R&A in its governing body role for the sport of golf, to communicate Rules changes and developments in the sport of golf.

I have submitted a Transportation Request Form

If you submit a Transportation Request Form to request permission to ride or use a form of transportation during an R&A championship or team event, we will use the information provided on that Form and in any supporting documentation to assess and process your request in accordance with that Form. Our legal basis for processing this information is your explicit consent and this information will be held until after the R&A championship or team event and will be destroyed no later than three months after the R&A championship or team event.

I am applying for a scholarship from The R&A

We use the personal information provided on a scholarship application form to process your application, to contact you in connection with your application and, if you are successful, to provide you with the award.

Our legal basis for processing your personal information provided on a scholarship application is that it is necessary for our relationship with you established by your scholarship application. The R&A cannot process your application if you do not provide the information required by the form.

If your application is successful, we provide your personal information to the administrator specified on your application form for the purposes of payment of the award to you.

We retain unsuccessful scholarship applications for a period of five years and we retain successful applications for a period of seven years from the date of the award of the scholarship.

I am applying to be reinstated to Amateur Status

We use the personal information provided on an application form to process your application in accordance with Procedure for Reinstatement of Amateur Status and to contact you about your application including to inform you of the outcome.

Our legal basis for processing your personal information provided on an application form is that it is necessary for our relationship with you established by your application. The R&A cannot process your application if you do not provide the information required by the form.

We provide details of your application to your home union and the professional association that you are a member of to allow them to support your application.

We retain successful and unsuccessful applications indefinitely in order to monitor your changes in professional status.

I want to know my data protection rights

Data protection legislation in the EU and UK provides individuals with certain rights regarding the use of their personal information.

If you would like to contact us to exercise your rights, please contact us using the contact details at the beginning of this privacy policy.

You have the right to:

- access the personal information that we hold about you in many circumstances;
- ask us to delete or correct any personal information that we hold about you;
- prevent us processing your personal information;
